## Rhodes State Offers Summer Police Academy

LIMA, Ohio – Rhodes State College is offering a Basic Police Academy this summer. After successful completion of the Police Training Academy, students are qualified to take the required Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) certification test to be a peace officer in Ohio.

**The class sessions are scheduled from June 2, 2012 – September 12, 2012. Application deadline is April 19, 2012. Academy orientations will take place on April 25 and April 26, 2012.**

All students participating in the police academy must: 1) be at least 21 years of age at completion of academy, 2) pass an Ohio Bureau of Criminal Identification & Investigation (BCI & I) and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) records check, and 3) pass a physical examination by student's physician.

The training course consists of 600 instructional hours (33 college credit hours may be applied toward the two-year, associate degree in Law Enforcement at Rhodes State). Financial aid is available for qualified students.
