Certificate in **Medical Assisting**



Overview:

The Rhodes State Certificate of Medical Assisting will prepare you as a multi-skilled healthcare professional who is qualified to perform administrative, clinical and laboratory procedures within an outpatient health care environment. We are the only Allied Health profession that teaches both administrative and clinical skills. Most medical assistants work in physician offices – generally day hours and no evenings, weekends or holidays.

One day a week on campus

- Requires just one day a week (Tuesday) on campus for lab/hands-on learning
- Entire program is about 42 weeks long (begins August 21, 2023 and ends approx. August 2, 2024

Online learning and "test out" opportunities to fit your busy schedule

- 75% of the total curriculum offered online or in blended format.
- Consider "test out" options for those areas you are already familiar in such as medical terminology or medical coding.
- Work with coordinator to waive all or part of the 160 externship hours if you have previous medical office experience.

After completion of the certificate, these students are eligible to take the Certified Medical Assistant (CMA) exam offered by the American Association of Medical Assistants (AAMA). *For eight years, Rhodes State has earned a 100% pass rate on the CMA exam.* The certification program of the Certifying Board of the AAMA is accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA) and complies with the NCCA Standards for the Accreditation of Certification Programs.



Highlights:

 Rhodes State College is less expensive than two other area medical assisting programs in the area. The overall cost is \$10,763 which includes tuition, textbooks and other misc. expenses. Other programs range from \$12,400 for certificate program to over \$28,080 for 18-month program.

Employment:

- According to the U.S. Dept of Labor, Medical assistant job outlook is projected to grow 16% until 2031
- According to OhioMeansJobs.com, there are the following openings within a 30 mile radius of:

 Full-time medical assistants with CMA (AAMA) certification earn an avg of \$20.76/hour (salary data from O*NET)
